DAILY RESPONSIBILITIES

Immediate Spill Cleanup: Promptly remove all food and liquid residues, especially in food preparation, display and storage areas. Focus on high-risk zones like deli counters, bakeries and produce sections.
Proper Waste Handling: Use secure, tightly sealed bags and place all rubbish into bins fitted with secure lids. Empty bins frequently, especially at the end of each day
Leak Prevention: Detect and repair any leaks from refrigeration units, plumbing or roofs immediately. Pay special attention to areas around sinks, drainage and floor traps.
Surface Sanitation: Regularly wipe down all food preparation surfaces, floors, shelving and equipment with approved sanitising agents. Clean under cooking stations, display cases, and refrigeration units.
Access Control: Ensure all entrances, including loading docks, delivery doors and customer entry points are fully closed and sealed during non-operational hours. Repair any damaged weather stripping.
Inspection of Food Stocks: Regularly examine all incoming supplies for signs of rodent damage, such as gnaw marks, droppings or compromised packaging. Reject any infested items.

WEEKLY MAINTENANCE

Storage Area Upkeep: Organise storage spaces, remove unnecessary items from the floor and maintain clear aisles to eliminate hiding spots for rodents.
Cooling and Dry Storage Checks: Inspect walk-in freezers, coolers and dry storage areas for nesting materials like shredded paper, fabric or rodent droppings.
Drains and Pits Check: Ensure all drainage systems, gullies and floor traps are clean, free of debris and functioning correctly. Treat drains with appropriate enzymatic cleaners.
Surface Examination: Look for visual signs of rodent activity, such as fresh droppings, gnaw marks, rub marks along walls or urine stains. Inspect shelves, pallets and equipment.

MONTHLY INSPECTION ROUTINE

Structural Sealant: Inspect all utility entry points (pipes, wires, cables) and seal any visible gaps or cracks with suitable, rodent-proof sealants.
Container Integrity: Ensure all trash receptacles, recycling bins and compost containers are intact and have no holes or cracks.
Building Perimeter & Exterior: Check exterior walls, roofing, loading docks and surrounding landscaping for openings, cracks or potential entry points. Trim vegetation away from the building foundation.
External Environment: Look for active burrows, runways or evidence of recent rodent activity outdoors, especially near dumpsters or loading docks.
Facility Surfaces: Conduct detailed inspections of vulnerable areas such as loading bays, piping, electrical switch boxes and support pillars.
Storage and Waste Zones: Thoroughly clean storage rooms, loading dock areas, dumpster enclosures and remove any signs of nesting, debris or spilled food.

YEARLY EVALUATIONS

Waste Management Review: Service or replace dumpsters as needed. Evaluate the overall waste disposal system, including frequency of collection, container sizes and location.
Contract and Site Review: Collaborate with your pest management provider to review past activity, update treatment strategies and refine site protections.
Comprehensive Site Survey: For ongoing or recent rodent sightings, conduct a detailed assessment with your pest control provider to identify and address new risk zones and potential entry points.
